
One of the winners at Selborne – John MacKinnon. Rick hardy was his partner but could not stay for prize giving. They had 44 points.



New Golf Rules 2019

Many of us are still unfamiliar with the many rule changes that came into effect this year. Here are a few of them:

- You may now putt with the flag in, and Ready Golf is encouraged. Some clubs have measured a reduction in round times of 15 minutes, primarily due to these two changes. However despite the rule listed as 20 below, if your ball rests against the flag, but no part of the ball is below the ground, you must take it as the ball is NOT in the hole, and replace it next to the hole.
- You MUST now drop from knee height and the ball must come to rest within the drop area. There is a 2 shot penalty if you drop from higher and play the ball. If you are warned before playing, you may re-drop the ball with no penalty.
- You may not have your caddy / partner stand on your line from the moment you start to take up your stance. Your line extends beyond the flag. There is a 2 shot penalty for this. If you notice your caddy / partner standing on your line, you may step away, ask them to move and retake your stance with no penalty.
- There is no penalty for you ball accidentally striking yourself / caddy / partner or equipment.

Completion of the Cards

At our recent Kloof fixture we managed to have labels with the correct information now required on your card. Beside the Format, date, tee. Time and name you need to specify what tee you have elected to play off, your Handicap Index and your Course Handicap. All cards will over time migrate to this format

This is essential for our Handicap Officer, Frans Kemper, to check compliance of scores entered. While overall compliance is good, he does find the following occurrences which are viewed in a serious light if the same person does it more than once:

- Not opening a round and then not entering a good score
- Entering a score higher than achieved.

Ensure you comply, otherwise don't be offended when Frans has to send you a note!

The new Golf Rules that come into effect on 1 Jan 2019 are aimed at speeding up play.

"Ready Golf" is now the accepted norm and you are requested to adopt this style of play. Specific things we can all do to speed up...

□ Focus on your next shot and prepare for it while the others in your 4 ball are playing their shots

□ Drop off your cart partner and move to your shot as soon as he has selected his club

□ Park your cart / trolley at the green exit point when you arrive at the green

The Captains challenge to Seniors' is to complete your round in under 4 hr 15 mins including half way!
